Abbreviations that may be used (there will be others):

CRO coloured roads only for navigation and route CAR consider all roads for navigation but CRO for route WUW will use whites consider all roads for navigation and route

NTR No Through Roads are NOT included in the navigation
My definition of an NTR is a road that does not 'go'
e.g. the narrow yellow heading SE at 819 879¾ is an NTR
Also, roads leading off the edge of the map will also be classed as NTR but be careful – for CRO navigation the wide yellow heading SSE at 165½ 052 is an NTR but for CAR and WUW navigation it does not become an NTR until 167¾ 045¾

Any instruction in brackets is to be treated as an avoid e.g. (H) do not travel along a road that passes through the letter H (54) do not pass through SH54

The avoid only applies to the section with the instruction and does not turn the road into a NTR

MAP:

O.S. Landranger map 144

The latest revision will have a map legend 'Revised May 2019'

The navigation will also be checked against the previous revision with a map legend 'Revised June 2013'

For digital map users the plotting area is bound by
Eastings 77 & 17 and Northings 70 & 10
Bottom Left E 577000 N 270000 to Top Left E 577000 N 270000
Top Right E 617000 N 310000 to Bottom Right E 617000 N 270000

ROUTE CHECKS:

Always a tricky challenge for a paper-based event, my solution has a nod back to the days pre-Crow where maps were marked up and posted in for marking

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Part of your entry package is a London Road Book style list of 144 eight figure grid references, each will have a unique reference number, all will plot on junctions, simply solve the route card and your route checks for that section will be a list of route checks passed through, in order with a direction of approach and depart e.g., NE 55 S

To make things slightly easier as well as the list of references, a sixteen-page pdf with each page covering a 10km x 10km section of the map showing the location of the references will be available on the website (it is a large file), see table below for which page covers which bit of the map

References can be submitted with or without leading zeroes

Valid directions of approach and depart are N NNE NE ENE E ESE SE SSE S SSW SW WSW W WNW NNW and can be upper, lower, or mixed case

PENALTIES:

The event is made up of four cards, each card has five legs (aka sections) and each leg has a minimum of one and a maximum of ten route checks

The penalty for a missing route check is 5 marks

The penalty for a route check wrong approach / depart is 1 mark there will be organisers discretion on interpretation of directions

The penalty for an off-piste route check is 2 marks

The penalty for requesting a hint is 2 marks (see below)

CLASSES:

The route and navigation on most sections will be different for each class

The route is continuous with each section either starting at the end of the previous section, as on all rallies, unless specifically stated, the same bit of road cannot be used more than once

Novice: section start will be given, some section finishes will be given, most sections will have a hint

Expert: section start may be given, some section finishes will be given

HINTS:

Hints may be requested by E-mail, the penalty is 2 marks per hint requested

RESULTS:

Links to individual route check forms will be emailed to individuals in groups of 5 (one group for each card), the groups will be emailed over a period of 40 days (most of the admin is manual), how

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and when answers are submitted is up to you, there is also a plan B option to submit answers by pdf form and email

Results will be published on the website

Solutions will be published on the website after results have been finalised

Results will be classified by marks lost

GENERAL:

Use the Comments box on the Route Check Form or E-mail percy@sccon.co.uk to 'discuss' questionable bits & pieces

Where the route is defined by specific things (spot heights, map features etc) in the route card navigation then any specific thing not included in the route card navigation should be avoided

A grid line is only considered to be 'crossed' when the whole road (the black line on both sides) crosses the line questionable crossings can be 'discussed'

A spot height / mile stone / mile post must have a visible black dot on the road to be counted, one or two of the spot height black dots are hidden by map features and theses have been clarified in the navigation

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
